earliest convenience so that
the service at the Dispensary
should be complete. -

Some of the members protest-
ed against the careless and
negligent manner with
which their last annual
report was printed. The
typographical errors are
so numerous that the report
was thought to be to the
discredit of the institution;
therefore a committee of two,
consisting of Dr^s Mary. P.
Jacobi and Dr C. Williams
were appointed to bring
this respectful protest

to the notice of the Super-
vising Committee and the
Board of Directors -

Finally it is my painful
duty to inform the Super-
vising Committee that the
President of Hon. Board
of Directors finds fault
with some of the newly
appointed members of the
dispensary staff for not
attending their classes re-
gularly - and, during their
absence, the poor sick, who
wait sometimes for hours
at the dispensary, have to
leave on that account, un-
attended to the detriment of
the service & the patients.

The secretary begs to state that he does not make any complaint against any member of the Staff, but simply notifies the Supervising Committee of the irregular attendance on the part of some of the Atty. physicians - at the request and by authority of the President of the Board of Directors of the hospital.

The applications of Dr. John E. Ferdinand of 230. W. 125th St. - and of Richard G. Wiener - were presented and ordered to be placed on file.
